

STUDENT HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Recommendations:

- DTaP vaccination to be administered at age 11-12 years for those who have completed the recommended childhood DTP/Dtap vaccination series and have not received a Td (tetanus and diphtheria toxoids) booster dose.
- HPV (human Papillomavirus) vaccine (3 dose series) to females at 11-12 years. Vaccinate all older girls and women (through age 26) who were not previously vaccinated.
- MCV4 (meningococcal vaccine) at age 11-12 years & and at age 13-18 yrs. if not previously vaccinated.
- Varicella vaccine (chicken pox) 2 doses for persons aged 7yrs. – 18 yrs (without evidence of immunity)
- Flu vaccine, vaccinate every year to children aged 6mo-18yrs.

MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL (Ed Code 49423)

If a student is required to take medication while at school:

1. A Medication Permit form by the health care provider indicating the method, amount and time schedules by which such medication is to be taken (physician's instructions on permit should match directions on container. The form should be signed by the parent indicating the desire that the school district assist the pupil in the manner set forth in the physician's statement.
2. All medication must be in the original container from the pharmacist, complete with name and physician's directions.
3. All medication must be kept at the school office. Medication will be administered by a school official. (Ed. Code 11753.1)
4. The parent (not the student) must bring the medication with a completed medication permit.



STUDENT INSURANCE

The District does not provide insurance coverage for student accidents or injuries.

All students who are participating in a district extra curricular sports event must have insurance.

Insurance may be purchased for your student, inquire at the school office.

HEALTH HISTORY

Please complete all health history forms and include any pertinent medical information concerning your student that the school should be aware of i.e. allergies, medications at school etc.

EMERGENCY CONTACTS & FIRST AID

In the event of a student accident, the school is only responsible for first aid.

If an injury is of a serious nature, the parents will be notified immediately.

If a serious emergency occurs, the paramedics will be called first, then the parents.

If an ambulance is required, parents/guardians will be billed by the local ambulance company.

FOR YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY AND SECURITY

Student emergency cards must be kept up to date, with current address and phone numbers, emergency contacts and their current phone number.

NO NITS!!

Winton School District has a very firm *No-Nits* policy. **THIS MEANS** that a student's hair must be completely free of nits (lice eggs-alive or dead) in order to be in school.

If a student has lice or nits, please call the school office so that a check can be made of the classroom/students.
